Affirmative

I/You/We/They start at 9 o'clock, starts He/She/It

Negative

I/You/We/They do not (don't) finish at 9 o'clock. does not He/She/It (doesn't)

Spelling rules: he/she/it

- Most verbs: add s works, gets, writes
- Verb ending in -o, -sh, -ch, -x: add -es goes. finishes, catches, relaxes
- Verbs ending in a consonant + y: change y to -ies - studies






