The Truth about Great British Weather



England is famous for bad weather and most people agree that Britain is always cold and wet, but is this actually true all year round? In fact the climate of Britain is very varied, summers are often usually warm and winters are mild, it doesn't often snow, but it's true that it rains all year.

In the summer the weather can be extremely changeable and in one day can change from sunny, to rainy, windy and even foggy! The bad news for sun lovers however is that summer temperatures rarely go above 30°C in most areas and in some parts of Great Britain the temperature in the summer can be around 10°C! However for most of England the average summer temperature is usually around 20°C.



Your summer holiday can be a very different experience depending on where you go in Britain. The Atlantic Ocean to the west of Britain brings warm air currents and means that the weather in the west is often mild. but it's also sometimes wet and windy. In the popular tourist destination of the Lake District it rains a lot and often with an average annual rainfall total that exceeds 2000 mm. The southeast in contrast has warm summers and 18 surprisingly dry, it hardly ever rains (contrary to stereotype) - London receives less rain annually than Rome, Sydney or New York!
